Score stools individually **from 1 (formed and dry) to 5 (liquid)**. When consistency of the stools is not homogenous, record the higher score. TOO HARD/ TOO SOFT

ACCEPTABLE

OPTIMAL

HARD, DRY, CRUMBLY STOOL (crumbs)

It tends to split apart rather than being crushed.

DRY, VERY CLEARLY DEFINED CRACKS The outside is very dry and the inside is almost dry.

Leaves no residue on the ground when picked up.

C It

CLEARLY DEFINED SHAPE WITH VISIBLE CRACKS

It leaves very little residue on the ground when picked up.



MOIST STOOL STARTING TO LOSE SHAPE AND CRACKS

This stool's "components" are less separate and the cracks are still visible.



MOIST STOOL WITH NO CRACKS

The stool still has a distinct shape. This stool's different "components" stick to one another.



MOIST STOOL WITH LITTLE CONSISTENCY AND NO REAL SHAPE

It holds water well. No floating "stool-water" is visible.



LIQUID STOOL WITH MINIMAL CONSISTENCY

ENTIRELY LIQUID STOOL (no texture).

FORMED, DRY AND HARD FECES

FORMED, DRY BUT NOT HARD FECES

Cylindrical shape feces, dry appearance, separated in pellets. Harder ones can be deformed with some difficulty (fig. II) or more easily (fig. III).

SOFTER ONES ARE SLIGHTLY STICKY (fig. IV)

SOFT FORMED FECES

Formed but very soft feces. Cylindrical shape separated in pellets (fig. V) or with presence of stria (fig. VI). Softer ones are pasty, still cylindrical shape but no stria (fig. VII).

SOFT UNFORMED FECES

Feces mainly unformed with a small formed part (fig. VIII) or pasty unformed feces (fig. IX & X). In some cases (fig. IX) a cylindrical shape is visible (a), but is not maintained due to the high humidity.





LIQUID FECES ASSOCIATED WITH SOFT FECES

The main part of the feces is represented by soft (fig. XI) or liquid (fig. XII) feces.

LIQUID FECES (fig. XIII)
